The ALLELUIA BOX that sits in front of the altar throughout Lent is a symbol that we no longer use the "A"-Word (*Alleluia*) till Our Easter Vigil service with the announcement of the Resurrection of Christ. The children at the 9:00 AM Service of February 11 (The last Sunday of Epiphany prior to Ash Wednesday) processed the "A"-word Banner around the church and sang vigorously for the last time a hymn with the "A"-word Refrain, and deposited the banner into the wooden chest where it will lie *buried* till our Easter Vigil celebration. At Easter as we sing the "*Gloria*" again, the box is opened and the banner is displayed among the Easter flowers.

WORSHIP NOTES for LENT. With the Season of Lent many changes occur in our worship so as to contrast the glory, joy, and victory of the Resurrection of Christ. Examples are that the "Alleluia" is omitted from the liturgy, silences are more intentional, kneeling for a longer version of the Confession, Prayers of the People, and the Eucharistic Prayers is practiced. Crosses and statues are veiled as a symbol of mystery and to hide any ornamentation that "distracts" us from focusing on Christ and the grace and love of God. Purpled is the color of the season, the color of penance, reflection, and humility.

The Dean's Challenge for Lent: "Change for Change" One of the

disciplines that are often "taken up" during Lent is *almsgiving*. This is an opportunity with just pocket change alone to change lives! This **Challenge for the 40 days of Lent** is to build homes for the poor. **Only 90 cents per day - \$36 for all of the 40 days of Lent (from 100 families would give us \$3,600)** can provide a safe, sturdy double -unit home for a desperately poor family in Honduras, Nicaragua or Jamaica. A Food For The Poor house offers secure shelter to a family in need and keeps their children safe from wind, storms and strangers who could hurt them. Sacrificial giving to build a home for a poor family gives our Trinity Family another means to share God's love, especially in light of the hurricane devastations of this past year. We can transform a poor family's life while experiencing the joy of serving Christ by helping the poorest of the poor during this Lenten season. **P.S.** — This challenge will be matched again this year! With this match, Trinity can provide two double-unit home for the cost of one. Saving boxes were made available for the children at the 9:00 Service. Last year we took in just over \$3,700.00.
