Education Wednesdays Return August 23–Sept. 27!

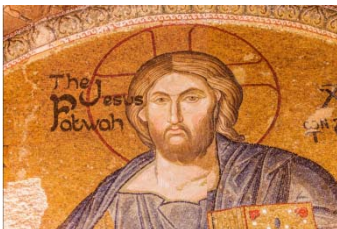
— New Time! New Format! Special Events! —
