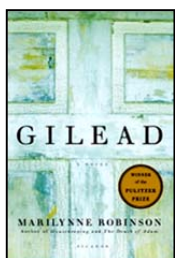

Bible & Books returns today at 9:00 AM with *Gilead: A Novel!*

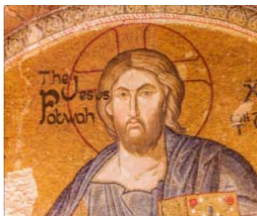
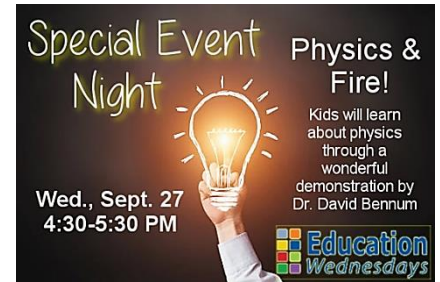

Education Wednesdays now in session for its first five weeks through October. We start at 4:30 PM

Education Wednesdays are especially geared toward children in grades K–5, and are open to all children whether or not their parents attend Trinity or whether they are Episcopalian. Feel free to bring your friends! Class begins at 4:30 PM for children and adults. Children have rotations of Art, Bible story, and Music. A brief kid-friendly Chapel will be at 5:30 PM with dinner following. The second Adult class begins at 6:15 PM. Education Wednesdays will run in five or six week sessions four times a year.



The Adult class is studying: **The Jesus Fatwah: Love Your (Muslim) Neighbor as Yourself.** Fr. William is teaching a five-week DVD course about Islam as part of our Education Wednesdays. The class meets at **4:30 PM and repeat at 6:15 PM.** Much of what passes for information about Islam is weed-like disinformation rooted in stereotype and watered by fear. In *The Jesus Fatwah*, seventeen Islamic and Christian scholars offer reliable information about what

Muslims believe, how they live out their faith, and how we all can be about building relationships across the lines of faith.
