Fund update Why is Trinity's Endowment Fund important? An endowment fund refers to assets that are invested in perpetuity, unlike expendable funds which are typically used for immediate needs. The Endowment Fund is intended to provide support for the

mission and ministry of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral.

Each year, the board of trustees may make recommendations for disbursements from the fund which may include any and all accrued interest in the Fund consistent with the trust instrument. The amount of interest that could be disbursed in 2018 is, on the low end \$4,000 up to a disbursement on the high end of \$23,000.

The board's goal is to grow the Trinity Cathedral Endowment Fund to one million dollars. By growing the Endowment Fund to one million dollars through gifts and prudent investment management, it will ensure Trinity Cathedral's future strength and resiliency in the diocese of Nevada and in the Reno/Sparks community.

After careful consideration of our investment options, the board trustees have decided to move forward with The Episcopal Church Foundation to empower Trinity Episcopal Cathedral Endowment Fund's future growth. Some of the advantages of this change include low fees, an investment philosophy/style appropriate for church endowments, planned giving support and services, professional management-using the largest manager of charitable assets in the world: State Street Global Advisors and the support in bringing about vibrant, growing Episcopal communities of faith.

The Endowment board trustees would very much like to see the principal balance of the fund grow to \$800,000. The fund balance is currently at \$764,000. To get started, the Endowment Fund board trustees have created a charitable gift challenge! When you to give to the Endowment Fund we'll match your gift, up to \$13,000, to help the Endowment Fund grow. Please consider a gift to the Trinity Episcopal Cathedral Endowment Fund today.

- For those involved with CIRCLES, this is akin to the effort that reaches out to community leaders to create partnerships with families in poverty, only on a larger scale.
- For those involved with FISH or other front-line agencies, this would engage in advocacy on behalf of their faith communities.
- For those involved in church or synagogue or temple outreach, this is the kind of effort Deacons make on behalf of their faith communities.

AT THE END OF JUNE we will have a UTO Ingathering! The United Thank Offering (UTO) is a ministry of the Episcopal Church in the United States that is dedicated to function generously for the mission of the whole church throughout the United States. Through UTO yearly drives, individual church members are invited to embrace and deepen one's personal daily spiritual discipline with a gift of "gratitude" in the form of filling an UTO box with loose change or more for collection in the offering plate and the end of the UTO yearly campaign in May. The 2018 UTO grant session is focusing on "Becoming a beloved Community; Racial Healing, Reconciliation, and Justice," Episcopalchurch.org/united-thank-offering. 100% of the donations are awarded to support and needed ministries of Episcopal Parishes throughout the country! There are UTO boxes, envelopes and information at the north entrance of the Cathedral. Several entities of this Diocese of Nevada have been grateful recipients of grants from the national United Thank Offering, i.e. Camp Galilee, St. Paul's, St. Stephen's, and St. John's church at Dixon. We ourselves after the flood of 1997 received \$50,000 for the crypt sprinkler system.



Your generosity has been a very major aid in securing monies for necessary projects that would surely go unfunded without the support of grants from UTO. Please prayerfully consider all the blessings you have each day, and make effort to put something in your UTO box each day to fill it by the beginning of June for our spring ingathering.
