# A Note from Dean Tim

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone." (1 Corinthians 12:4-6)

This coming Saturday marks the beginning of the Annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity by the World Council of Churches. This is the main ecumenical framework for the Church of God, divided as it is into many branches. Our Epistle reading from First Corinthians this Sunday is a timely reminder that although there are many scattered Christians throughout the world, at base God provides all the gifts from which we minister in our various branches of the Church. When all is said and done and the incense or smoke-machines are silent, we all seek to serve God and give glory through the gifts we have been given.

As a show of our commitment to working with one another locally, the clergy leaders of the four downtown churches are participating in a pulpit exchange for our main services this weekend. Reno's much beloved Father Chuck Durante, Rector of Thomas Aquinas Cathedral, will join with us here to break open the Word in his sermon. I will be preaching at First United Methodist, whose minister, The Rev Dr. George Edd-Bennett, will preach at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd. Pastor Scott Trevithick from Good Shepherd will round out the exchange by preaching at Thomas Aquinas Cathedral.

It's been a good beginning this year for my relationship with these fellow clergy, with whom I share much in common in pastoral focus. In addition to this exchange, we are working on a few other events together. We are coordinating a shared Blessing of the Palms Liturgy in Wingfield Park on Palm Sunday. And most of you know of our partnership with the Reno Initiative for Shelter and Equality (RISE), where we are providing an overnight warming center for women and families experiencing homelessness. This is occurring on a four-week rotation.

Our next Hosting week for the RISE Warming Center begins on January 28. I'm asking for volunteers to assist

with welcoming our guests in the evenings, from 8:30p to 9:30p, and with assisting them in departing for their days from 5:30a to 6:30a. Please contact me at the office if you feel called to help. RISE is coordinating volunteers to assist overnight as well, and if that is a ministry that is calling to you, please volunteer with RISE: <a href="https://renoinitiative.org">https://renoinitiative.org</a>.

It is good that we have these relationships and ministries with our fellow Christians downtown. Pray for the unity of the Church in this coming week of Christian unity:

God our Father, accept our praise and thanksgiving for what already unites Christians in the confession of and witness to Jesus the Lord. Hasten the hour when all churches will recognize each other in the one communion you willed and for which your Son prayed to you in the power of the Holy Spirit. Hear us, you who live and reign now and forever. AMEN

# **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity**

On Sunday January 19 we welcome Father Chuck Durante of St. Thomas Aquinas Cathedral to Trinity as part of this year's Pulpit Rotation, celebrating the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Our own Dean Tim will be visiting the First United Methodist Church, right across the river.

The year 2025 marks the 1,700th anniversary of the first Christian Ecumenical Council, held in Nicaea, near Constantinople in 325 CE. This commemoration provides a unique opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians, as expressed in the Nicene Creed, which traces its origins to the Council of Nicaea. The Council of Nicaea led to the adoption of the Nicene Creed as an expression of the common faith of Christians.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2025 offers an invitation to draw on this shared heritage and to enter more deeply into the faith that unites all Christians.

## A Word from your Endowment Committee

At the start of this New Year, many of us will take the opportunity to re-evaluate our wills and trusts to ensure that those plans still reflect our wishes, desires, and current situations.

For example, events like weddings and births may prompt us to make changes in our plans; so may the acquisition or sale of property or other assets. Relocating to Nevada from another state may trigger changes. Certainly, a death or divorce may cause us to rethink and restructure our plans.

Making a bequest in your will and living trust for Trinity's Endowment Fund helps to provide a strong earthly financial future for our congregation. It also provides a powerful testimony to our family members about our priorities, stewardship, and trust in our Lord.

The following language may be helpful to your attorney should you decide to give to Trinity in this way: "I give, devise and bequeath the sum of \$(specific amount) or (X asset) to Trinity Episcopal Church, (Federal tax ID #88-0073425), a Nevada non-profit organization located at 201 Island Avenue, Reno Nevada 89501. This bequest is to be used for the benefit of the Trinity Endowment Fund."

You may also leave a percentage of your estate, or a percentage of your estate after the payment of debts. You may designate that your bequest be used to fund something specific like our music program, missions, youth program, or capital campaign.

There are some other options available to you as well, depending on your situation. These options may help you leave a bequest to Trinity and reduce your estate taxes at the same time. Since all of our situations are different, you should consult with an estate planning attorney for the proper legal advice.

So as the New Year begins, remember to take some time to make sure your will and trust reflect your current situation and desires. If you have not created a will and living trust, be sure to contact an attorney who specializes in this area of the law. There is no better time than right now to make sure your earthly affairs are ordered the way you want them.

# The Lessons Appointed for Use on the Second Sunday after the Epiphany



#### The Collect

Almighty God, whose Son our Savior Jesus Christ is the light of the world: Grant that your people, illumined by your Word and Sacraments, may shine with the radiance of Christ's glory, that he may be known, worshipped, and obeyed to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### The Lesson: Isaiah 62:1-5

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest,

until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch.

The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory;

and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give.

You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate;

but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married;

for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married.

For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your builder marry you,

and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

## The Response: Psalm 36:5-10

5 Your love, O Lord, reaches to the heavens, \* and your faithfulness to the clouds.

6 Your righteousness is like the strong mountains, your justice like the great deep; \* you save both man and beast, O Lord.

7 How priceless is your love, O God! \* your people take refuge under the shadow of your wings.

8 They feast upon the abundance of your house; \* you give them drink from the river of your delights.

9 For with you is the well of life, \* and in your light we see light.

10 Continue your loving-kindness to those who know you,  $\ast$  and your favor to those who are true of heart.

#### The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and

to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

## The Gospel: John 2:1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
