The Dean's Dispatch

Grant, we pray, Almighty God, that as we believe your only-begotten Son our Lord Jesus Christ to have ascended into heaven, so we may also in heart and mind there ascend, and with him continually dwell; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. (BCP, p. 226)

I was ordained to the priesthood on Ascension Day in 2017, which happened to be May 25th that year. A fun little factoid was pointed out to me by my first Church Musician, who noted that Hymn 525 (5/25... get it?) is "The Church's One Foundation..." Episcopalians usually know that one by heart and so we know that the second line is the important one: "...is Jesus Christ our Lord!" All that we do in worship and service is intended to demonstrate that fact. Christ is the base of all that we build and do.

The prayer above (reread it) is one of two collects offered for Ascension Day in the Book of Common Prayer. We will observe the feast on Sunday and Diana will preach. I like this particular collect because it demonstrates the odd dichotomy with which we Christians live. Our hearts and minds are fixed on Christ in heaven, but our bodies and work exist on Earth. Sometimes it stretches us in ways we couldn't imagine before they happen. Sometimes that stretch tears at us a bit... it is a workout much like lifting weights. The resistance of weight and gravity against our flesh creates micro-tears in our muscles that strengthen them. Holding things in tension strengthens us.

I'm constantly reaching to pull together both things. As dean I'd rather be hanging out with people and attending to pastoral needs. But I am often called to focus on doing the little daily tasks that create liturgy and meaning for everyone who comes to Eucharist. Or I am as likely to be plunging a toilet or attending any number of committee meetings for the parish and the diocese. All too often that can pull my mind into the thisness of the world and away from anchoring to Christ in heaven. I suspect this is not a major surprise, given our American focus on getting administrative things done. But it can throw me off in the tension that builds us up, pulling me out of good form. And good form is critical to getting stronger. It's critical to stay balanced.

So, this coming week, I will attend a Credo conference. Some observant folks have noticed that both Bishop Elizabeth and I are attending Credo conferences this year and asked what they are. These are opportunities the Church provides for clergy, getting us out of our parishes (and our heads) every five years to spend a little time considering how to rebalance, refresh, and return to lead better those entrusted to our pastoral ministry. I am grateful for this opportunity, coming so quickly on the heels of my ordination anniversary, to work on balancing to be the best shepherd for you that I can be.

This does mean that I will miss celebrating Pentecost with you, and the parish picnic. That bums me out a bit and I thought about cancelling. But that would be unbalanced. The opportunity only comes around every five years or so, and I missed my first shot due to the pandemic. So, I am going. And, I hope, will return better for it... for you.

Have a great Pentecost, Parish Picnic, and your own faith workout. Jesus Christ, our one foundation, needs us strong for the work He is preparing us to do. I'll see you on the way.

UNR's Shared History Program Seeks Participants

Our research documents historical and modern forms of community building and perseverance while highlighting stories from historically underrepresented groups. We are especially interested in looking into these groups' perspectives on housing, the meaning of home, and community.

We're collecting oral histories in Northern Nevada. The oral historical process aims to collect first-hand accounts of past events and personal or community perspectives on lived experiences. In this process we aim to include diverse, intergenerational voices to create a rich tapestry of Nevada's history. Our interview process typically takes 1 to 2 hours. Interviews are either in Lincoln Hall at the University of Nevada, on site, or at a location convenient for our interviewees.

**The Lessons Appointed for Use on
Ascension Sunday**

The Collect

Grant, we pray, Almighty God, that as we believe your only-begotten Son our Lord Jesus Christ to have ascended into heaven, so we may also in heart and mind there ascend, and with him continually dwell; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.



Old Testament: Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

The Psalm: Psalm 97

1 The Lord is King;
let the earth rejoice; *
let the multitude of the isles be glad.

2 Clouds and darkness are round about him, *
righteousness and justice are the foundations of his throne.

3 A fire goes before him *
and burns up his enemies on every side.

4 His lightnings light up the world; *
the earth sees it and is afraid.

5 The mountains melt like wax at the presence of the Lord, *
at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth.

6 The heavens declare his righteousness, *
and all the peoples see his glory.

7 Confounded be all who worship carved images
and delight in false gods! *
Bow down before him, all you gods.

8 Zion hears and is glad, and the cities of Judah rejoice, *
because of your judgments, O Lord.

9 For you are the Lord,
most high over all the earth; *
you are exalted far above all gods.

10 The Lord loves those who hate evil; *
he preserves the lives of his saints
and delivers them from the hand of the wicked.

11 Light has sprung up for the righteous, *
and joyful gladness for those who are truehearted.

12 Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous, *
and give thanks to his holy Name.

The Epistle: Ephesians 1:15-23

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and

above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

The Gospel: Luke 24:44-53

Jesus said to his disciples, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you-- that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.
