The Dean's Dispatch

All the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." (Luke 15:1-2)

This is a different note than I intended to send this week. I had hoped to focus on the good beginning of our program year. But the violence we have witnessed this week demands a different reflection. I am deep in my feels on this, so please forgive if this dispatch is lacking my usual polish.

Unsurprisingly, social media exploded at the news of the assassination of an influencer, Charlie Kirk, on the eve of 9/11. The lack of decency in the discourse was exactly as my current experience indicated it would be. I have friends and followers in both of the intractable political camps of our era. Many called for empathy, but a disturbingly high number of people called for war in their comments on my friends' posts. It's not cute. It's deadly serious. "War is sweet to those who have no experience of it, but the experienced man trembles exceedingly at heart on its approach," wrote Pindar long ago. I tremble at its approach. We all should.

The scripture is replete with words to call us back from the brink of whatever this place is where we find ourselves:

- Micah's call to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God (Micah 6:8).
- Paul's call that if possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all (Romans 12:18)
- And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful (Colossians 3:15)
- And let us not forget Jesus' beatitudes, especially "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they called be called children of God" (Matthew 5:9)
- And his great commandment that we must love God and love our neighbor as ourselves (Matthew 22:37-40)

And that is just an appetizer, a scriptural charcuterie board. God desires that we love one another. Those who follow Jesus have no other alternative than to walk away from our salvation. Almost 2000 years ago, Jesus submitted to human violence to show us that, in the end, it can't win. This is what the resurrection promises and proves.

Thursday morning, I read an article about the coming point at which the information on the internet will be almost entirely produced and shared by AI and bots. It stated that there is good evidence that 48% of the content we consume daily already fits in this camp, elevated in your feed by an army of bots. That is terrifying to me, if true. It is also a wake-up call about the level to which we are all being manipulated.

This begs the question, "Are the emotions you are feeling really yours or are they under manipulation by others?" I think the only way to find out is to set our devices down and actually meet with one another in conversation. Preferably around meals. Definitely at church.

So, perhaps it was the Holy Spirit that influenced my choice for our first Adult Forum for this program year. She's crafty like that and it can't be better timed. Rev. Dr. Jesse Zink's great book, *Faithful, Creative, Hopeful: Fifteen Theses for Christians in a Crisis-Shaped World* will lead us through a Christian response to the polycrisis in which we currently find ourselves, shaping us to offer an alternative to the anxiety and anger of our current discourse. We have something amazing to share with this world and I think this book will help us be more effective in that. I hope you will join us Sunday at 10am for our first session.

And I hope that we will gather as brothers and sisters for our Common Table potlucks, being organized by Mikkel and Marlyse. See below for more on that.

I'm convinced that our only hope is in the peace of Christ, in our loving one another, and in inviting all others into our fellowship.

Let's keep loving one another, y'all (yes, I just came back from Texas).

And pray for one another and for our Nation that calmer heads and better fellowship will prevail. It can if we invite those other sinners and eat with them, despite all critics.

The Common Table

Trinity Cathedral is launching a new monthly gathering starting **Wednesday October 1st** called The Common Table; a pot luck event which will be held on the first Wednesday of every month.

How it will work: 3-4 single/couples will host each monthly potluck dinner. Hosts are responsible for Parish Hall set-up, registration, and clean-up. Fellowship/appetizer will start at 6 PM, any salad prep, etc at 6:20 PM, grace and dinner at 6:30 PM.

Attendees will be divided alphabetically into four groups to provide mains, sides, appetizers and desserts. Dishes should be pre-made and fully prepared, i.e. no cooking required. The ovens will be used for warming only. There will be sign-up sheets in the sanctuary so we can track who is coming. Store bought food is perfectly acceptable. It would be helpful if you brought your own serving utensils. Please label your items so you can find them easily to take home.

Each dish should serve 8-10 people. Trinity will supply coffee/tea/juice. Attendees can bring their own wine/beer. (No spirits allowed, including seltzers)

Contemplative Outreach of Northern Nevada is presenting a free Introductory Centering Prayer Workshop. This event will be hosted by Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Reno, Nevada on **Saturday, October 4 from 9am – 1pm** in the sanctuary.

The centering prayer workshop will teach a method of silent prayer that is rooted in the Christian contemplative heritage. It is a gentle silent method of consenting to God's presence and action within us. By taking time to "rest in God" each day, we open ourselves to the gift of God's presence. Come and learn more about this transformational prayer practice.

The program includes talks by Contemplative Outreach presenters and instructional videos by Fr. Thomas Keating, O.C.S.O. Participants will practice Centering Prayer together and there will be time for questions and discussion. The book *Open Mind, Open Heart* by Father Thomas Keating is the primary book for the course and may be purchased at the workshop (cash only, subject to availability). 

The Collect

O God, because without you we are not able to please you, mercifully grant that your Holy Spirit may in all things direct and rule our hearts; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The First Lesson: Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28

At that time it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert toward my poor people, not to winnow or cleanse-- a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgment against them.

"For my people are foolish, they do not know me; they are stupid children, they have no understanding. They are skilled in doing evil, but do not know how to do good." I looked on the earth, and lo, it was waste and void; and to the heavens, and they had no light. I looked on the mountains, and lo, they were quaking, and all the hills moved to and fro. I looked, and lo, there was no one at all, and all the birds of the air had fled. I looked, and lo, the fruitful land was a desert, and all its cities were laid in ruins before the LORD, before his fierce anger. For thus says the LORD: The whole land shall be a desolation; yet I will not make a full end.

Because of this the earth shall mourn, and the heavens above grow black; for I have spoken, I have purposed; I have not relented nor will I turn back.

there is none who does any good.
2 The Lord looks down from heaven upon us all, *
to see if there is any who is wise,
if there is one who seeks after God.

all alike have turned bad; *
there is none who does good; no, not one.
4 Have they no knowledge, all those evildoers *
who eat up my people like bread

and do not call upon the Lord?
5 See how they tremble with fear, *
because God is in the company of the righteous.
6 Their aim is to confound the plans of the afflicted, *
but the Lord is their refuge.
7 Oh, that Israel's deliverance would come out of Zion! *
when the Lord restores the fortunes of his people,
Jacob will rejoice and Israel be glad.

The Epistle: 1 Timothy 1:12-17

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners-- of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

The Gospel: Luke 15:1-10

All the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."

So he told them this parable: "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

"Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.' Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."
