Luke 15:1-10

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

May the leaders of the church be like Moses – one with their people and an outspoken advocate on their behalf, we pray to the Lord. ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

That the church will dedicate itself to searching for the lost – the homeless, the addicted, the uneducated, the ill, the rejected – and that we will welcome them to our household, we pray to the Lord. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For all who are alienated from the church, and who stay away from God's table, that they may return home, and that we may be watching to greet them with open arms, open minds, and open hearts, we pray to the Lord. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For those in the armed forces of this and every nation, especially those deployed in harm's way, and that our aggressions against each other may cease, we pray to the Lord: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For the sick, the aged, the lonely, especially Duane, Emily, Sally, Elle, Luke; and in our Diocesan Cycle of Prayer, we join the Bishop today in praying for our Diocesan Retired Clergy and Surviving Spouses of Clergy; and those we name either silently or aloud [*please add your own intentions*]. That they may know God's mercy and our kindness, we pray to the Lord. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

For all who have died, especially David, Dan, John, Wesley, and those we name either silently or aloud [*please add your own intentions*]. For the victims of senseless gun violence and violent attacks around the globe. We pray to the Lord: **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Presider:*

God of promises, you have brought us a long way and have kept us safe on our journey to and in you. Hear us now, and answer our prayers with your grace. Teach us to turn to you for what we

need to do your work in the world. We make our prayers in the name of Jesus, our Lord. **Amen.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

***It is right to give him thanks and praise.***

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth...

...Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

### **The Sanctus**

Hymnal S-129

***Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.***

***Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.***

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and

gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

***Christ has died.***

***Christ is risen.***

***Christ will come again.***

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. ***Amen.***
