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## **The Canon's Corner**

What We Believe: Living the Nicene Creed

As we travel these fifty days of Easter—held by the Nicene Creed, walking dusty beside one another—we keep learning what resurrection looks like in real time. These ancient words steady us as we go, reminding us that faith is something we grow into together. In this season when life keeps breaking through the cracks, we listen for how the Creed continues to shape our steps, our belonging, and our hope.

### **Jesus Christ, God With Us - God Walking Beside Us**

As the Creed leads us deeper into faith, the journey draws closer to its heart. We confess Jesus Christ—not a distant guide pointing the way, but God who walks the road with us.

In Jesus, God enters our journey fully, sharing birth and growth, friendship and loss, joy and suffering. Christ knows what it is to walk dusty roads, to grow tired, to stop and listen. God doesn't remain removed from the path but joins us on it.

This changes how we walk. We aren't striving toward God alone but learning to notice His presence already beside us. Christ meets us in ordinary moments and difficult ones alike.

For all who feel unseen, uncertain, or overwhelmed, this is good news: God is nearer than we imagine, faithful step by step.

### Group explores the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius

A vibrant group journeyed together through the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola, a prayer practicum, during Lent at Trinity. Facilitated by the Rev. Dr. Julius Rogina, the group met weekly to learn, pray, and share with one another. The Exercises encourage a daily prayer practice that encompasses self-awareness, compassion, gratitude, and deep listening to the workings of God's Spirit, leading to a more fully awakened and meaningful life. In addition to the weekly group meetings, participants met regularly in pairs as spiritual companions. The practicum concluded this week with members sharing their own personal statements of faith and expressing appreciation for one another and the experience as a whole.

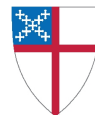

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## The Lessons Appointed for Use on the Fourth Sunday of Easter



### The Collect

O God, whose Son Jesus is the good shepherd of your people: Grant that when we hear his voice we may know him who calls us each by name, and follow where he leads; who, with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

### The First Lesson: Acts 2:42-47

Those who had been baptized devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

**The Response:** Psalm 23

1 The Lord is my shepherd; \*  
I shall not be in want.

2 He makes me lie down in green pastures \*  
and leads me beside still waters.

3 He revives my soul \*  
and guides me along right pathways for his Name's sake.

4 Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,  
I shall fear no evil; \*  
for you are with me;  
your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

5 You spread a table before me in the presence of those who trouble me; \*  
you have anointed my head with oil,  
and my cup is running over.

6 Surely your goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, \*  
and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

**The Epistle:** 1 Peter 2:19-25

It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps.

"He committed no sin,  
and no deceit was found in his mouth."

When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

**The Gospel:** John 10:1-10

Jesus said, "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."
