The Dean's Dispatch

Grant, O merciful God, that your Church, being gathered together in unity by your Holy Spirit, may show forth your power among all peoples, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. (BCP p. 232)

The Collect prayer above is the prayer for this Sunday. In addition to being said at Eucharist, we will also pray it throughout the week as a part of Morning and Evening Prayer. I love how it points out that the power of the Church comes through our unity. Now, we don't individually have a lot of say over the unity of the Church catholic (universal). Generally, our individual power rarely

extends beyond our nose. But this Collect prayer can be a good reminder that Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, Reno, is capable of powerful things here, locally, when we are gathered together in unity.

I'm going to set aside my recent focus on project management, capital fundraising, and stewardship a moment to express what I hope you know to be true about me. My greatest joy in my ministry is in just being with you... gathering with you at events or when you call me to come and join you in moments of joy and sorrow. Being together is what the Church is all about... not having the largest congregation and best church structure in the diocese. The most beautiful thing at Trinity is that a group of people from all walks and levels of life gather together to share in the mystery of faith.

So, in this Dean's Dispatch, I want to focus most upon the major events we have upcoming as a community:

August 30, 2026: Parish End of Summer picnic. Join with your fellow Trinitarians for great food and fellowship following the 10am Eucharist. Sponsored by our men's group, A Lot of Good Men. Bring a side or dessert to share!

September 13, 2026: Our Program Year begins! On this Sunday we return to the program year worship schedule: 5pm Saturday Evening (Rite II, said) and Sunday morning services at 7:30am (Rite I, said), 9am (Rite II Family Service, Sunday School begins), and 11am (Choral Rite II Eucharist).

October 17, 2026: EYC Spaghetti Dinner at 6pm. Come have some delicious food and support our youth group as they raise funds for their next adventure! They recently returned from a trip in Hawaii, where eight of our EYC crew met with episcopal youth from all over the western United States and the pacific islands at a Provincial Youth Event. Now they need to raise money for the next trip, so come on out and support them through delicious carb loading!

November 6, 2026: Phantom Night! Our own Dorothy Papadakos, erstwhile organist of the cathedral of St John the Divine in New York City (a VERY big deal) returns to the biggest little cathedral in the world, where she first learned to play. She will present organ accompaniment to the original silent film version of "The Phantom of the Opera" (1925). Dorothy is sharing her skillful artistry as a gift to her formative parish to help kick off our final round of fundraising for the Parish Hall renovation. A gala masquerade soiree (wear a mask and costume) will follow with a silent auction. It's going to be a great night, and tickets will be on sale soon!

Because we are loading up on evening events, we are looking at holding "The Common Table" potlucks a little less often, in those months where we do not have a major parish life event. So, keep a careful eye on the Carillon this year to keep up with all that's happening at Trinity.

It's going to be a HUGE year for us as we hopefully finalize design work and kick off renovations of both the Parish Hall and of the new Rectory that Dorothy Brighton left her parish. The future is bright at Trinity! I am glad we're all in it "together in unity"!

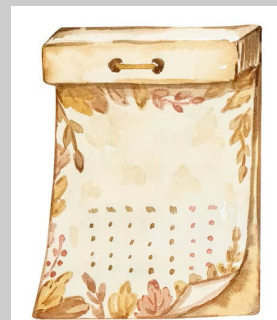

The Canon's Corner

Come Follow Me by Canon Diana+

In a world where many people wonder whether they belong, Jesus' message remains strikingly simple: Come.

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus invites people into a relationship with Him—fishermen, tax collectors, seekers, children, sinners, and skeptics. He doesn't wait for perfect faith, perfect understanding, or perfect lives. He meets people where they are and offers rest to the weary: "Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I'll give you rest."

Over the past several weeks, our Gospel readings have reminded us to listen to Jesus. At the Transfiguration, the disciples heard, "This is my Son, the Beloved... listen to him." In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus continues to call us to listen, trust, and recognize that

God's grace reaches beyond the boundaries we often imagine. Listening to Jesus isn't simply about hearing His words; it's about letting them shape how we live, who we welcome, and how we love.

Jesus' call to "Follow me" is more than an invitation to walk beside Him. It's an invitation into a life of grace, mercy, love, and purpose. The Church continues that invitation today—not as a club for those who've got everything figured out, but as a gathering place for people seeking God's presence and learning to love God and neighbor together.

As followers of Christ, we're called to reflect His welcome. If Jesus made room for the stranger, the lonely, and the burdened, so should we. In a divided world, the Church can offer something different: a community centered on Christ, where all are invited to draw closer to God and to one another.

This month, consider how you might answer Jesus' invitation and extend it to someone else. Invite a neighbor to worship. Welcome someone during coffee hour. Reach out to a friend carrying a heavy burden. Offer a listening ear, a kind word, or a simple act of hospitality.

We don't need to do extraordinary things to share Christ's love. Often, the simplest invitations are the most powerful: Come and see. Come and pray. Come and belong.

Jesus' invitation hasn't expired. It still echoes through Scripture and through the life of the Church:
Come. Follow. Listen. Belong.

May we answer that invitation more fully and become people through whom others can hear it too.

There is room for you here. Come and discover the love of Christ with us.

Grant, O merciful God, that your Church, being gathered together in unity by your Holy Spirit, may show forth your power among all peoples, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Old Testament: Isaiah 51:1-6

Listen to me, you that pursue righteousness,
you that seek the Lord.

Look to the rock from which you were hewn,
and to the quarry from which you were dug.

Look to Abraham your father
and to Sarah who bore you;
for he was but one when I called him,
but I blessed him and made him many.

For the Lord will comfort Zion;
he will comfort all her waste places,
and will make her wilderness like Eden,
her desert like the garden of the Lord;
joy and gladness will be found in her,
thanksgiving and the voice of song.

Listen to me, my people,
and give heed to me, my nation;
for a teaching will go out from me,

and my justice for a light to the peoples.
I will bring near my deliverance swiftly,
my salvation has gone out
and my arms will rule the peoples;
the coastlands wait for me,
and for my arm they hope.
Lift up your eyes to the heavens,
and look at the earth beneath;
for the heavens will vanish like smoke,
the earth will wear out like a garment,

but my salvation will be for ever,
and my deliverance will never be ended.

The Response: Psalm 138

1 I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with my whole heart; *
before the gods I will sing your praise.
2 I will bow down toward your holy temple and praise your Name, *
because of your love and faithfulness;
3 For you have glorified your Name *
and your word above all things.
4 When I called, you answered me; *
you increased my strength within me.
5 All the kings of the earth will praise you, O Lord, *
when they have heard the words of your mouth.
6 They will sing of the ways of the Lord, *
that great is the glory of the Lord.
7 Though the Lord be high, he cares for the lowly; *
he perceives the haughty from afar.
8 Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you keep me safe; *
you stretch forth your hand against the fury of my enemies; your right hand shall save me.
9 The Lord will make good his purpose for me; *
O Lord, your love endures for ever; do not abandon the works of your hands.

The Epistle: Romans 12:1-8

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God-- what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

The Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.
