"So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." (1 Corinthians 10:31 NRSV)

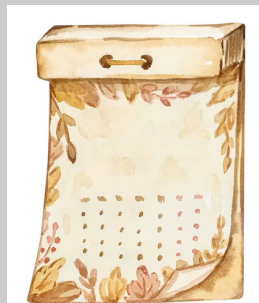
Program Year Begins September 13

The Canon's Corner

Bearing Witness by Canon Donna+

I've been on the road a lot this month, in nearly every corner of the diocese. It's been fun experiencing the variety of congregations that make up our diocesan community. My persistent conviction, that I carry home each week, is how important our particular witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ is. Last week the Gospel lesson asked us, "who do you say that I am?" The way we answer that question, as Episcopalians, includes a lot of wiggle room! Not because we don't have the conviction of faith, but because we recognize that the God of ALL creation is bigger and more wonderful than anything we can ask or imagine. (Eph 3:20) We can get caught spending too much energy trying to narrowly define who God is and who God calls us to be. I'm grateful that the Episcopal church draws on all the language and imagery of Scripture and the history of the church to talk about God.

I'm also deeply grateful for a liturgical and sacramental life that sustains us, even when words or intellectual understandings fail. The liturgy can speak for and in us, whether we are in the midst of spiritual darkness or experiencing a flowing river of love and faith. We are fed by Christ's own body and we are held in the ancient confession of faith that stretches through the whole history of the Church. Part of that breadth of faith and worship is a recognition that God's people are equally wonderful and more diverse than any single collection of people. And so we boldly proclaim that All Are Welcome - and seek to live into that conviction more fully all the time.

Our world needs this witness. Reno needs this witness. The community we build at the cathedral, the diocesan congregation, is such a wonderful expression of our Episcopal identity. And it is so important that we remember that this isn't meant for us alone. We are called by God to share the good news with others! So tell your friends what you do on Sunday mornings - or Saturday evenings. Tell people why it matters to you. And tell people that there is a way to be a Christian that doesn't require us to have everything figured out or to draw lines between people who are different from us. This might help grow Trinity and the Episcopal

Church, but more importantly, it shows people that whoever they are, whatever they're going through, they have a place in the reign of God.

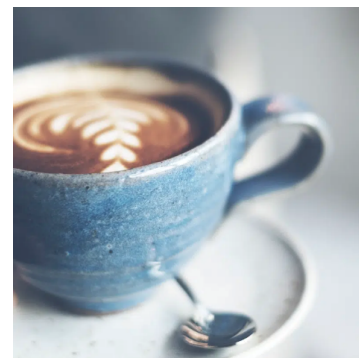

The Collect of the Day

Rite I:

Grant us, O Lord, we pray thee, to trust in thee with all our heart; seeing that, as thou dost alway resist the proud who confide in their own strength, so thou dost not forsake those who make their boast of thy mercy; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Rite II:

Grant us, O Lord, to trust in you with all our hearts; for, as you always resist the proud who confide in their own strength, so you never forsake those who make their boast of your mercy; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The Old Testament: Ezekiel 33:7-11

You, mortal, I have made a sentinel for the house of Israel; whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. If I say to the wicked, "O wicked ones, you shall surely die," and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but their blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked to turn from their ways, and they do not turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but you will have saved your life.

Now you, mortal, say to the house of Israel, Thus you have said: "Our transgressions and our sins weigh upon us, and we waste away because of them; how then can we live?" Say to them, As I live, says the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from their ways and live; turn back, turn back from your evil ways; for why will you die, O house of Israel?

The Response: Psalm 119:33-40

33 Teach me, O Lord, the way of your statutes, *
and I shall keep it to the end.
34 Give me understanding, and I shall keep your law; *
I shall keep it with all my heart.
35 Make me go in the path of your commandments, *
for that is my desire.
36 Incline my heart to your decrees *
and not to unjust gain.
37 Turn my eyes from watching what is worthless; *
give me life in your ways.
38 Fulfill your promise to your servant, *
which you make to those who fear you.
39 Turn away the reproach which I dread, *
because your judgments are good.
40 Behold, I long for your commandments; *
in your righteousness preserve my life.

The Epistle: Romans 13:8-14

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

The Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20

Jesus said, "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."
